Hello 3-Wheelers,

The riding season is now upon us and soon it will be time for my rigs to face the annual MA. State Inspection once again. (Grrr) Maybe it's an age thing but because of my procrastination, all of the maintenance and repairs that I should have done over the winter months never got done. So, now I'm really going to have to hump because 2 of my rigs will not pass inspection and the 3rd I really can't ride. The torsion suspension on my ancient GL1000/California FS1 let go and fortunately for me Guy Hill had an old set of springs that Sarge gave him years ago that he was kind enough to pass on to me so that I could rebuild my suspension. That was last fall. So did I fix it over the Winter? no no no. My Valkyrie/Oxford needs tires. Did I get to that? Not really. And last but not least I'm pretty sure my GI1500/Escort needs an alternator. I guess with 112,000 miles I should have expected it. I took it out for a late season spin last December to circulate the gas stabilizer and I heard a squealing noise coming from the motor but it was getting cold and dark so I put it away figuring I would check it out in the Spring. A few weeks ago I took it out for about a 30-mile spin and it ran great with no more noise. I thought all was well until I tried to start it this week. (By the way, the battery is new and checks out fine) I still need to check my charging system to be sure, but I'm thinking alternator. After looking on line I noticed that almost all of the alternators available are made in China including the expensive high amp Compufire as well as the OEM from Honda. Have any of you Wing guys in the club had any experience with this. Lactrical is an affordable brand that seems to get decent reviews but I would like to get some more feedback. If any of you can offer some suggestions give me a call or send me an email.
